## VALENTINE'S DAY, NARCISSUS, EROS AND PSYCHO

Recently, a <u>viral video appeared on the internet</u>. In two hours, that video was viewed by five million people.

The video was made by a man who publicly proposed to his girlfriend. And, not only that! He took her to the cinema for the premiere of her favorite animated film "Thornbill" and when there, the main characters are the two of them.

The animated young man in the movie kisses his sweetheart and she wakes up from a hundred-year-old dream. He pulls out a box with a ring, which he throws into the audience.

The man at the cinema, jump, grab the box and kneel down to propose to his sweetheart. Of course he does it all, looking and winking at the camera that captures it.

What a show!

And just comments!

"Wow! Where do these men live?"

"All honor. Eh, that's a real man!"

"I was crying! How romantic! "

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"He set high standards for men. Hardly anyone will overcome it. "

And, not only women, even men were delighted with this kind of engagement.

The young man received all the praise and collected all the applause. But that was his intention, wasn't it?

Narcissistic personality disorders want to be admired. And they want applause.

Is the man from the story a narcissistic personality disorder? And, if so, how do we know?

Psychiatrists who spend their working lives in psychiatric clinics can evaluate whether they are personality disorders by their face physiognomy. One such psychiatrist is Jasmin Hamidović, and he has dedicated his research to this personality and here's what he says:

"There are numerous scientific evidence that static facial features provide some information about personality traits, and therefore personality disorders. Facial features are essential to create a first impression of personality. Whether one is reliable, potentially aggressive, well-intentioned, dominant, etc. can be inferred from certain facial features (face width, nose shape, jaw shape, eye size, etc.), of course with other features such as body posture, tone of voice, tone, manner of expression, etc. The appearance of the face can be used to predict a person's behavior and some transient emotional states, such as surprise or fear. They are indicated by certain changes in face physiognomy.

The man in the video declares love to his girlfriend and begs her without any emotional involvement. The tone of his voice shows no excitement and fiddling with the camera indicates that he wants to appeal to a wide mass of people, which is a characteristic of narcissistic disorder although this cannot be determined with certainty. "

A few months ago, I had a workshop "Women's Conversations," and we talked about why successful and beautiful women are single after thirty-five.

Since almost every woman in her life has had at least one narcissistic personality disorder beside herself, it is established that when she realizes that such a connection is not okay, she is not interested for emotionally available men. They are boring to them.

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Why is it like that?

It is interesting that only Western culture nurtures a cult of romantic love and considers romance and infatuation the only true basis for marriage, which is not only wrong but also crazy. Also, more interesting is that men are the initiators of romantic love and women are just the canvas for their film projection. Just like the woman from the beginning of the story. The more beautiful a woman is, she has a better chance of being a canvas. And the more romantic a man is, he has a better chance to success with women.

The incredible beauty of Psyche has seduced even Eros himself, a god of passion and sexual lust: falling in love offers passion. But like any woman who was initially offered the pedestal of the goddess, Psychic became a goddess. So, an immortal woman.

Let's go back to narcissistic personality disorder and its name.

The narcissist was, in fact, a Narcissist, and that's where the narcosis comes from, which means insensitivity.
